Kenya officially the republic of Kenya, is a sovereign state in the African great lakes region of East Africa. Its capital and largest city is Nairobi.

Kenya has a warm and humid climate along its Indian Ocean coastline, with wildlife-rich savannah grasslands inland towards the capital. The African Great Lakes region, which Kenya is a part of, has been inhabited by humans since the Lower Paleolithic period. Until the country was granted independence from Britain, its name was pronounced "Keenya", but at independence the pronunciation was changed to "Ken-ya"
